What is Supported Education?

Since 1989, the Supported Education program at Laurel House has been committed to assisting individuals with mental health conditions to work towards their academic goals. We work closely with students to: choose a post-secondary program (in college, or a vocational certification, or GED program); enroll; complete financial aid applications; and provide ongoing assistance.

Laurel House's Supported Education program achieved the highest fidelity award rating, **Exemplary**, from the State of CT Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.



How does it work?

Our goal is to assist each individual with success strategies for accessing supports and maximizing potential.

We tailor services to help identify goals, strengths, and areas for improvement.

We meet students, at their convenience, on campus, in the community, or at our office, to remove barriers to accessing our services.



What services do we provide?

- Goal planning and career exploration
- Academic skills training
- Informational tours on campus
- Guidance when working with faculty
- Information on accessing on-campus supports
- Help securing disability accommodations
- Help registering for classes
- Assistance applying for financial aid and scholarships
- Skills training groups
- Assistance with the college application and transfer process

Tele-Education Support Program (TEdS)

- Counseling, guidance, and support to succeed in college and other post-secondary education
- Provides wrap-around supports to students who live away from home on or near their school campus
- Communication through FaceTime, Skype, text and phone, in addition to in-person meetings to ensure transition to on-campus services.
